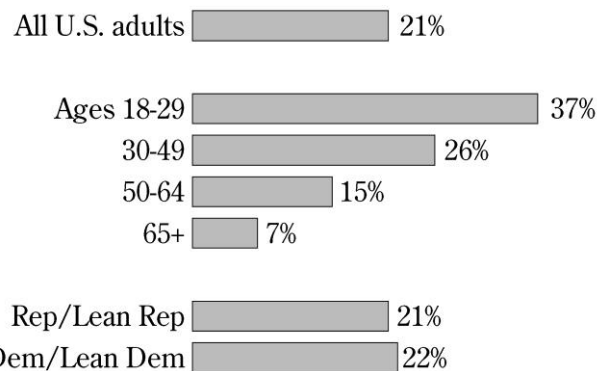
【IV】 アメリカの成人の情報源に関連する次のグラフと英文を読んで、それぞれの問いの答えとして最も適切なものを選び、その番号を記しなさい。

**How many Americans get news from influencers\*, and what is their experience?**

About one-in-five U.S. adults (21%), including 37% of adults under 30, say they regularly get news from influencers. Most of them say influencers have helped them better understand today's news and public problems, and that the news they get from influencers is different from the news they get from other sources\*.

Who are these news influencers? Around three-quarters (77%) have no past or present affiliation with\* a news organization. There are about twice as many men as women. And among those who talk about political views, more people say they are conservative\*.
